

q	AB 773	Baker (R)	Licenses: Medical Board: Board of Psychology	Amends the Psychology Licensing Law that establishes the Board of Psychology to license and regulate the practice of psychology and provides that the formula for the expiration of a license to practice. Requires such licenses to expire at the end of a specified time period from the date the license was issued. r	AB 750	Low (D)	Business and Professions: Retired Category: Licenses	Authorizes any of the boards, bureaus, commissions, or programs within the Department of Consumer Affairs to establish by regulation a system for a retired category of license for persons who are not actively engaged in practice. Prohibits the holder of a retired license from engaging in any activity for which a license is required, unless regulation specifies the criteria for a retired licensee to practice. 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u	AB 1352	Eggman (D)	Deferred Entry of Judgment: Withdrawal of Plea	Requires a court to allow a defendant who was granted deferred entry of judgment, after pleading guilty or nolo contendere to the charged offense, to withdraw his or her plea and enter a plea of not guilty. Requires complaint dismissal if the defendant performed satisfactorily during the deferred entry of judgment period, and the plea may result in the denial or loss of employment, benefit, license, or certificate, or subject to adverse immigration consequences.	10/8/150- Approved by Governor	Watch
V	AB 1374	Levine (D)	Psychologists: Licensure	Removes the reference to fees for services from the psychology definition. Provides for the further modification of the definition. Eliminates authorization for credentialed psychometrists. Specifies actions included in the application of psychological principles and methods. Relates to the providing of licensure experience verification procedures for a trainee in a manner prescribed by the Board of Psychology. w	AB 1542	Mathis (R)	Workers' Compensation: Neuropsychologists	Provides that a medical doctor or osteopath who has successfully completed a residency program accredited by an organization and is recognized by the administrative director would satisfy the residency training requirement. Provides that a person who is certified in neuropsychology by specified boards or organizations and was appointed as a qualified medical evaluator in neuropsychology may be appointed as a qualified medical evaluator in neuropsychology. Veto message: Undermines the Division of Workers' Compensation's authority. у	SB 479	Bates (R)	Healing Arts: Behavior Analysis: Licensing	Revises the membership of the Board of Psychology. Establishes the Behavior Analyst Act. Requires a person to apply for and obtain a license prior to engaging in the practice of behavior analysis, establishes educational, training and application requirements. Requires proof of supervision. Provides Board enforcement authority. Creates an advisory committee. z	AB 85	Wilk (R)	Open Meetings	Amends the Open Meeting Act.
