In September Mr. Corey Brasier, Enforcement Analyst, resigned from the Board and accepted a position with the Department of Rehabilitation. The week of October 12 the Board conducted interviews for the vacant Enforcement Analyst position. The Board has made a conditional employment offer and anticipates the new employee will join the Enforcement team by mid-November. The new enforcement hire will conduct investigations, issue citations, process disciplinary cases, and perform other enforcement related duties as needed.

Expert training was held on September 29, 2015 at the Office of the Attorney General located in Sacramento. The training was a success, and the Board will also have training in December/January in Los Angeles for those experts practicing in Southern California. Additional information regarding changes to the Expert Review Program will be discussed during the Enforcement Committee Report.

COMPLAINT PROGRAM

Since July 1, 2015, the Board of Psychology has received 316 complaints. All complaints received are opened and assigned to an enforcement analyst within eight (8) days of receipt.

CITATION PROGRAM

Since July 1, 2015, 12 citations have been served. Citation and fines are issued for minor violations that do not require formal discipline. For example, false or misleading advertising, minor record keeping violations, and Continuing Education deficiencies are considered minor violations.

DISCIPLINE PROGRAM

There are 52 cases pending at the Office of the Attorney General. Of the 52 cases, 13 have been sent over since July 1, 2015.

PROBATION PROGRAM

Enforcement staff is currently monitoring 35 probationers. Of the 35 probationers, one is out of compliance. Staff will be forwarding these matters over to the Office of the Attorney General for

filing of an Accusation and Petition to Revoke Probation. Currently the Board has 40 tolled probationers.

Tolled refers to probationers who chose to leave California to reside or to practice outside the State for any reason. During periods of non-practice, the probationary period is tolled and respondent's license or registration shall be placed on an inactive status. The probationary period will not commence again until respondent activates his or her license and resumes practicing psychology in California.
