Agenda Item #6(a-b) – Licensing Committee Report and Consideration and Possible Approval of Committee Recommendations

(a) Requests for Extension to the 72-Month Registration Period for Registered Psychological Assistants

Background:

California Code of Regulations, Title 16, section 1391.1 provides in part:

(b) Registration as a psychological assistant shall be limited to a cumulative total of six years (72 months). Each registration shall be subject to annual renewal pursuant to section 1391.12.

For any psychological assistant registered prior to the effective date of this subdivision, subsequent renewals or registrations shall be limited to a cumulative total of six years (72 months) from the date of the psychological assistant's next registration or renewal, whichever occurs first.

Upon showing of good cause as determined by the Board, these specified time limitations may be reasonably modified.

During the Board meeting in May 20, 2016, the Board approved the Guidelines for Review of Request for Extension and delegated the authority to Board staff to approve straightforward extension requests to the 72-month registration period for psychological assistants and the 30-month limitation to accrue 1,500 hours of pre- or post-doctoral supervised professional experience.

Recently, the Board has received two extension requests that exceed the maximum amount of time (i.e., one year) staff is allowed to grant approval pursuant to the Guidelines.

1) Psychological Assistant #1 – Request for a Two-year Extension to the 72-month registration period

#1 was issued a psychological assistant registration on February 1, 2001, which will expire on October 23, 2017 according to the 72-month limitation rule with the genesis date

beginning on October 23, 2011. A second psychological assistant registration was issued on June 27, 2005, which has expired since January 31, 2017.

#1 expressed agreement with the Board that psychological assistantship is not a career but a path to licensure; however, age, language barrier, and the multiple choice examination system have contributed to the inability to pass the licensure examination.

2) Psychological Assistant #2 – Request for a Three-year-and-five-month Extension to the 72-month registration period

#2 was issued a psychological assistant registration on April 12, 2011, which will expire on October 23, 2017 according to the 72-month limitation rule.

#2 explained that during the initial three years and five months of being registered as a psychological assistant, #2 was also registered as a Marriage and Family Therapist (MFT) Intern. Hours accrued during the initial years were intended for the MFT license, hence requested the expiration date of the psychological assistant registration to be calculated beginning on September 19, 2013.

(b) Supervision Agreement Plans for Supervised Professional Experience in Non-Mental Health Services

California Code of Regulations, Title 16, section 1387.3 provides in part:

This section pertains only to those trainees who are preparing for practice, once licensed, in the non-mental health areas of the profession of psychology.

Due to lack of training sites and qualified supervisors, typically in the area of applied psychological research, industrial-organizational psychology, media and social-experimental psychology, but not including those involving direct mental health services, trainees in these areas of psychology shall submit a plan for supervised professional experience to the board for approval on a case-by-case basis as provided for in section 2914(c) of the code. In all such cases, the proposed plan must be submitted by the supervisee and approved by the board prior to commencement of supervision. Supervised professional experience (SPE) which is accrued prior to the approval of the plan will not count towards licensure.

(a) Supervision Plan Required

The proposed supervision plan ("plan") submitted by the trainee for approval shall be signed by all participants involved. It shall describe the qualifications and responsibilities of the supervisor (and co-supervisor, if appropriate) for supervision. The plan shall be developed for and shall demonstrate appropriate preparation of the trainee to practice effectively in non-mental health services, and within the specific non-mental health setting. The plan shall address how the quality of work done by the trainee working in a non-mental health role will be monitored and assure protection of the client. As used in this section, "trainee" means a psychology trainee working under the provisions of this section.

Supervision Plan

The supervisee will plan to meet with at least one of the three supervisors for one hour each week on the (ifor direct, face-to-face supervision. When all of the supervisors are traveling and off-campus on client business, the supervision will continue using video-conference and phone calls. When various psychological projects require it, direct supervision meetings will be expanded up to four or five hours per week. Continuous contact is available via email and telephone and the supervisee with be incorporated in client projects as well as the planned program of psychologically-based educational programs. None of the supervisee's projects or client interactions involves mental health programs or interventions. Supervision meetings are structured interactions with attention paid to the well-being of the supervisee, the working environment including collegial and staff relationships, updates on current projects, the surfacing and addressing of any issues, and active reflection and learning from the work itself. Learning targets include personal and professional development of the supervisee, critical consulting psychology mindsets and skills, lessons about workplace and organizational dynamics, and the application of academic training.

I. At the postdoctoral level, this supervised professional experience (the "fellowship") offers advanced training to ensure higher level competency in the activities of a professional psychologist. The trainee will work as a psychological assistant at

), directly contributing to the evaluation and delivery of evidence-based digital mental health interventions. The trainee's primary responsibilities will include scientific research, intervention development, evaluation and improvement of risk management policies and procedures, and professional consultation.

Training provided during the fellowship will emphasize the following domains: development and implementation of evidence-based telehealth and digital mental health interventions; evaluation of online psychological assessment and screening procedures; evaluation and implementation of risk management policies and procedures for digital and telehealth practice; professional consultation; program evaluation; research methods; grant writing; study design and implementation; manuscript preparation and publication; organization management and administration; professional conduct, ethics, law, and standards of practice; and an understanding of issues relevant to the above.

The trainee's responsibilities and activities will be planned and sequenced to build upon her existing skills and provide additional training to prepare her for independent practice as a professional psychologist.

Duties to be Performed:

The trainee's responsibilities will be appropriate to her level of training, expertise and interest. Fellowship activities will include, but will not be limited to:

- 1. The trainee will receive up to two hours of weekly face-to-face individual supervision (one hour mandatory), one hour of weekly group supervision, and will attend a one-hour weekly staff meeting. Supervision will account for at least 10% of the trainee's total work time.
- 2. The trainee will conduct research investigating the efficacy and acceptability of evidence-based digital mental health interventions.
- 3. The trainee will receive continuing professional training and education in evidence-based cognitive-behavioral interventions (e.g. CBT, ACT, and DBT).
- 4. The trainee will receive training in research mentorship and supervision to junior members of the research team (e.g. providing research mentorship and supervision to Master and Doctoral-level students).

- 5. The trainee will receive training and will demonstrate competency in the ethics, law, and standards of practice related to the delivery of telehealth and digital health interventions.
- 6. The trainee will work under the supervision of the licensed clinical psychologist to develop novel, evidence-based, digital mental health interventions. This will include but may not be limited to conducting scientific reviews of literature, consulting with experts in specific fields, planning and implementing pilot studies, and overseeing the design and release of digital interventions.
- 7. The trainee will work with the primary supervisor to implement and monitor the effectiveness of online screening and assessment tools for common mental health disorders.
- 8. The trainee will work with the primary supervisor to evaluate and implement appropriate policies and procedures for managing risk according to emerging practice standards in digital health. This project involves the following tasks:
 - Participating on an interdisciplinary risk incident review team overseen by a licensed psychologist to evaluate clinical risk among users of a digital mental health intervention
 - b. Evaluating and implementing informed consent procedures for mobile-delivered digital mental health interventions
 - c. Developing evidence-based standards of practice for coaching in digital health
- 9. The trainee will work with the primary supervisor to provide consultation as-needed to non-psychology professionals in the development of evidence-based digital mental health interventions.
- 10. The trainee will receive training in writing grant proposals and will assist the primary supervisor with writing grant proposals to support evaluation of evidence-based digital interventions for target populations.
- 11. The trainee will attend professional trainings and conferences related to specific areas of interest.
- 12. The trainee will prepare manuscripts and will submit work for publication in peer-reviewed academic journals.
- 13. The trainee will participate in a monthly, 2-hour professional consultation and training meeting focused on evidence-based behavioral interventions.
- 14. The experience will consist of 40 hours of work per week and 4 hours of supervision per week, resulting in 44 total hours of supervised professional experience per week throughout the duration of the fellowship.

II. Goals and Objectives and Socialization into the Profession:

The trainee will be socialized into the profession of psychology by participating in team supervision, didactic training, professional meetings, and by contributing to the scientific literature. Mentorship will be provided by licensed professional psychologists employed at Lantern; additional mentorship will be provided by practicing psychologists specializing in evidence-based interventions who serve as advisors to ' in-house psychology team.

The trainee will attend monthly consultation and training meetings and will receive consultative

guidance from professional psychologists employed by and by sacademic partner institutions.

The trainee will receive didactic training addressing the integration of current and evolving psychological knowledge, specifically as this pertains to the Fellowship; for example, in the development and implementation of evidence-based interventions, the role of the therapeutic relationship in telehealth and digital interventions, and clinical best practices in psychological assessment and screening methods.

The trainee will attend at professional conferences and will receive additional training via membership in professional organizations.

III. Supervision:

Supervision will include one hour of mandatory weekly face-to-face supervision as well as further contact with the primary supervisor as needed via email, phone, video conference, and in-person meeting. The trainee will participate in weekly staff meetings which are attended by the primary supervisor, psychologists, other trainees, and other professionals, as well as weekly group and individual supervision with the primary supervisor and consultation with other licensed professional psychologist(s).

Didactic training will include topics related to all aspects of mental health intervention development and implementation. The trainee will also be expected to complete reading and scholarly inquiry to broaden her knowledge in particular areas.

The trainee will be provided supervision for 10% of the total time worked each week.
