SUBJECT	Agenda Item #5(b)(2)(H) – AB 349 (McCarty) Civil Service: Preference: Special Immigrant Visa Holder

## Background:

This bill would authorize any person who assisted the United States military and was issued a specified special immigrant visa to be ranked in the top of the resulting eligibility list if he or she achieves a passing score on an entrance examination in the State's civil service hiring process, except for in specified circumstances.

This bill previously would have required boards to expedite processing of and assist individuals with completion of their initial application for licensure if they had a specified special immigrant visa.

On June 14, the bill was amended to require the special immigrant visa holder to be ranked in the next highest group on the list whenever a veteran, widow, widower of a veteran, or the spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran is in the top rank.

Board staff spoke with the author's office and was informed that the bill is now a 2-year bill and will not be moving for the remainder of this legislative year. Staff will continue to watch the bill until it is taken up next year.
