Background:

The Committee provided their recommendation on amendments at the October 2017 meeting after reviewing comments and input from the two stakeholder meetings that were held in May and August in 2017. Staff has incorporated the Committee's recommended changes that are highlighted in yellow in attachments (See Attachment B1).

To enhance consumer protection, staff has provided language relating to the standardization of the trainee category for the Committee's consideration and discussion. This option would enable the Board to require all trainees to be registered with the Board prior to beginning providing psychological services under the supervision of a licensed psychologist (See Attachment A1).

Staff is also tasked to provide statistics on the number of psychological assistants who are working on their pre- and post-doctoral hours (See Attachment C). Further, staff is also seeking policy clarification regarding the requirements of Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology, out-of-state and out-of-country applicants, trainees in exempt settings, submission of supervision agreement for psychological assistant registration, etc.

§ 1381.5. Failure to Pay Initial License Fee.

An application shall be deemed to have been abandoned if an applicant fails to pay the initial license fee within three ~~two~~ years after notification by the ~~Board~~ that the fee for licensure is due. An applicant whose application has been deemed abandoned may again be eligible for licensure upon the filing of a new application and meeting all current ~~licensing~~ licensure requirements, including payment of any fees. Such applicant shall not be required to take the Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology (EPPP) but shall take and pass the California Psychology Supplemental Laws and Ethics Examination (CPSLEE).

§ 1382. Human Sexuality Training.

(a) An applicant for licensure as a psychologist shall complete as a condition of licensure a minimum of six (6) hours of coursework or applied experience in human sexuality, which includes the study of physiological, psychological and sociocultural variables associated with sexual identity, sexual behavior or sexual disorders, major treatment approaches and the specific ethical and legal issues related to practice in this area.

(b) This requirement shall be met in one of the following ways:

(1) Obtained as part of his or her qualifying graduate degree program. To satisfy this requirement, the applicant shall submit to the Board a written certification from the registrar or training director of the educational institution or program from which the applicant graduated stating that the coursework required by this section is included within the institution’s curriculum required for graduation at the time the applicant graduated, or within the coursework that was completed by the applicant.

(2) Obtained as part of his or her applied experience. Applied experience can be met in any of the following settings: practicum, internship, or formal postdoctoral placement that meets the requirement of section 2911, or other qualifying supervised professional experience. To satisfy this requirement, the applicant shall submit to the board a written certification from the director of training for the program or primary supervisor where the qualifying experience has occurred stating that the training required by this section is included within the applied experience.

(3) By taking a continuing education course that meets the requirements of subdivision (e) or (f) of section 2915 and that qualifies as a continuing education learning activity category specified in paragraph (2) or (3) of subdivision (c) of section 2915. To satisfy this requirement, the applicant shall submit to the board a certification of completion.

~~All persons applying for a license as a psychologist who began their graduate training on or after January 1, 2004, shall, in addition to all other requirements for licensure, have completed coursework in aging and long-term care which shall include but not be limited to the biological, social, and psychological aspects of aging, and shall submit documentation thereof of the board. The coursework in aging and long-term care shall consist of not less than a combined total of ten (10) contact hours focused on this topic.~~

~~The coursework shall be:~~

~~(a) taken in fulfillment of other educational requirements in the applicant’s graduate and/or doctoral training, or~~

~~(b) taken in a separate course approved by the board’s recognized continuing education accrediting agency, or~~

9 This section applies to all registered psychological assistants, pursuant to section 2913
10 of the Code, trainees, pre- or post-doctoral, who intend accruing for hours of
11 supervised professional experience (SPE) to count toward meeting the
12 licensing/icensure requirements stated in section 2914(ed) of the Business and
13 Professions Code. ~~These~~All registered psychological assistant/trainees accruing hours
14 of SPE supervised experience in areas of general applied psychology that do not include
15 direct mental health services must also/should refer to section 1387 subdivision (d) -3 for
16 information on establishing an alternate plan for SPE.

17
18 (a) SPE is defined as an organized program that consists of a planned, structured and
19 administered sequence of professionally supervised, comprehensive, clinical-applied
20 training experiences. SPE shall have a logical training sequence that builds upon the
21 skills and competencies of trainees/psychological assistants to prepare them for the
22 independent practice of psychology once they become licensed. SPE shall include:

24 ~~SPE shall include~~ (1) socialization into the profession of psychology and shall be
25 augmented by integrated modalities including mentoring, didactic exposure, role-
26 modeling, enactment, observational/vicarious learning, and consultative guidance.

27
28 ~~SPE shall include~~ (2) activities which that address the integration of psychological
29 concepts and current and evolving competencies, scientific knowledge, principles, and
30 theories to the professional delivery of psychological services to the consumer-public.

31
32 ~~SPE shall include~~ (3) only the time spent by the trainee/psychological assistant engaged
33 in psychological activities that directly serve to prepare the trainee/psychological
34 assistant for the independent practice of psychology once licensed. SPE shall not
35 include custodial tasks such as filing, transcribing or other clerical duties.

37 The term “trainee” as used in these regulations means a psychology trainee working
38 under one of the conditions listed in subsections (a)(1) and (a)(2) of this section.

39 (ab) Pursuant to section 2914(ed) of the eCode, two years of qualifying SPE shall be
40 completed and documented prior to licensure. One year of SPE shall be defined as

1 consecutive months. Upon showing of good cause as determined by the Board, these
2 specified time limitations may be reasonably modified.

3
4 (1) Pre-doctoral SPE: Up to 1500 hours of SPE may be accrued pre-doctorally but
5 only after completion of 48 semester/trimester or 72 quarter units of graduate
6 coursework in psychology, not including thesis or dissertation.

7
8 (2) Post-doctoral SPE: At least 1500 hours of SPE shall be accrued post-
9 doctorally. “Post-doctorally” means after the date certified as “meeting all the
10 requirements for the doctoral degree” by the Registrar or Dean of the educational
11 institution.

12 (c) Supervision Requirements:

13 (1) All SPE must be overseen by a primary supervisor.

14
15 (A) All primary supervisors must be licensed psychologists who meet the
16 requirements of section 1387.1(a), except for SPE accrued in areas of general
17 applied psychology, including but not limited to applied psychological research,
18 industrial-organizational psychology, applied developmental psychology or
19 consulting psychology, in which case the primary supervisor may be unlicensed.

20
21 If the primary supervisor is unlicensed, the psychological assistant must obtain a
22 co-supervisor who is a licensed psychologist that meets the requirements of
23 section 1387.1(c).

24 (B) The primary supervisor may delegate supervision to other licensed mental
25 health professionals who meet the requirements of section 1387.1(b).

26
27 (2) Psychological assistants shall have no proprietary interest in the business of
28 the primary or delegated supervisor(s) and shall not serve in any capacity that
29 would hold influence over the supervisor(s)' judgment in providing supervision.

30 (3) A maximum of 40 hours per week can be credited toward SPE. Time spent in
31 supervision can be counted toward the psychological assistant's SPE. One (1)
32 hour per week must be in direct, individual supervision with the primary supervisor.
33 Additional supervision can be provided by the primary, delegated, or co-
34 supervisor(s). See table below for supervision requirements.

1 (4) No supervisor shall request, receive, or facilitate the receipt of payment,
2 monetary or otherwise, from the psychological assistant as a condition for the
3 accrual of SPE.

5 (5) Experience gained while the psychological assistant is functioning under
6 another mental health license shall not be credited toward meeting the SPE
7 requirements for licensure.

8
9 (6) Prior to the start of the experience, the primary supervisor and the
10 psychological assistant shall together prepare an agreement (“Agreement”) that
11 outlines the structure and sequence of the planned program of supervision to
12 accomplish the goals and objectives of the experience. Hours accrued prior to
13 preparing such an agreement results in those hours not counting toward the

- 23 • Goals and objectives of the plan for SPE, including how socialization into the
24 profession will be achieved; and
- 25 • How and when the supervisor will provide periodic assessments and feedback
26 to the psychological assistant as to whether or not he or she is performing as
27 expected; and
- 28 • Attestation that both the supervisor and psychological assistant have
29 discussed and understand each term of SPE as required in sections 1387,
30 1387.1, 1387.4, 1387.5 of the Business and Professions Code.

31
32 (7) Once the SPE outlined in the Agreement has been completed, the primary
33 supervisor shall submit to the psychological assistant both the Agreement, unless
34 previously submitted to the Board, pursuant to Section 1387(c)(6), and a
35 verification of experience form signed by the primary supervisor under penalty of
36 perjury, in a sealed envelope, signed across the seal by the primary supervisor, for
37 submission to the Board by the psychological assistant with his or her application
38 for licensure. The verification shall certify to completion of the hours consistent
39 with the terms of the Agreement and contain the following information:

- 40 • Name and contact information of the psychological assistant
- 41 • Name, license number and contact information of the supervisor
- 42 • Start and end date of the experience
- 43 • Total number of hours per week worked by the psychological assistant
- 44 • Total number of supervised hours per week
- 45 • Total number of hours being verified

46
47 The supervisor must indicate, in his or her best professional judgment, whether the
48 psychological assistant demonstrated an overall performance at or above the level

1 of competence expected for the psychological assistant’s level of education,
 2 training and experience. When SPE is accrued in a formal pre-doctoral internship
 3 or post-doctoral training program, the program's training director shall be
 4 authorized to perform the verification and rating duties of the primary supervisor

 6 possesses a valid, active license free of any disciplinary action.
 7

8 If the SPE is not consistent with the terms of the agreement, or if the psychological

26 (10) Monitor the supervision provided by delegated supervisors.

28 (11) Be employed or contracted by the same organization as the psychological
29 assistant and be available 100% of the time SPE is being accrued. This availability
30 may be in-person, by telephone, or by other appropriate technology.

31
32 (12) Ensure that a crisis plan is in place to protect the client in the event a crisis or
33 emergency occurs during any time the supervisor is not physically present at the
34 location the psychological assistant is working. The primary supervisor shall
35 ensure that the psychological assistant thoroughly understands the crisis plan.

36
37 (13) Have the education, training and experience in the areas of psychological
38 practice for which they will supervise, and shall be responsible for supervising the
39 psychological functions performed by the psychological assistant and ensure
40 compliance with the provisions of the Code, the Board’s regulations, and the
41 ethical standards established by the American Psychological Association.

42
43 (b) A primary supervisor who is a licensed psychologist may delegate supervision to
44 another psychologist, licensed marriage and family therapist, licensed educational
45 psychologist, licensed clinical social worker, licensed professional clinical counselor or
46 board certified psychiatrist. Upon such delegation, the primary supervisor shall maintain
47 responsibility for providing the minimum one (1) hour per week of direct, individual
48 supervision to the psychological assistant, and ensuring compliance with this section.

- 27 (8) Monitor and report to the primary supervisor the performance and professional
28 development of the psychological assistant.

- 30 (9) Have no current or former financial, personal, or familial relationship with the
31 psychological assistant, or other relationship that could compromise the
32 supervisor’s effectiveness or violate the Ethical Principles of Psychologists and
33 Code of Conduct published by the American Psychological Association.
34

35 (c) If SPE is obtained in areas of general applied psychology, a licensed co-supervisor
36 is required if a primary supervisor is not licensed. The co-supervisor shall comply with
37 all of the following requirements:

- 39 (1) Possess and maintain a valid, active license issued by the Board free of any
40 formal disciplinary action during the period covered by the Plan;
41
- 42 (2) Notify the psychological assistant of any current disciplinary action that
43 disqualifies him or her from providing supervision;

- 45 (3) Prior to functioning as a co-supervisor and every two (2) years thereafter, the
46 co-supervisor shall complete six (6) hours of approved continuing education in
47 supervision that meets the requirements in section 1397.61(c)(1);

24 by a person who meets the requirements of section 1387.1(a) for a period not to exceed
25 thirty (30) consecutive calendar days in the event the primary supervisor is unavailable
26 for reasons including, but not limited to, illness, injury or vacation. Interim supervision
27 that is expected to continue for more than thirty (30) consecutive calendar days requires
28 a new Agreement pursuant to 1387(c)(6).

47 (b) An applicant shall successfully take and pass the licensing examinations prior to
48 being licensed. The licensing examinations shall consist of the Association of State and

2 Psychology (EPPP), and the California Psychology Laws and Ethics Examination

5
6 (c) An applicant is eligible to take the EPPP upon completion of a qualifying doctorate
7 degree and 1500 hours of qualifying professional experience. An applicant shall pass
8 the EPPP and complete all 3000 hours of supervised professional experience prior to
9 being eligible for the CPLEE, whichever is applicable, pursuant to section 1388.6.

10
11 (d) Upon application, the Board will notify applicants of their eligibility to take the EPPP.
12 Applicants are responsible for completing any administrative requirements for taking the
13 EPPP established by ASPPB or its agent, including paying any fees. This subsection

20 (f) Qualified applicants desiring to take the CPLEE shall submit to the Board the fee set
21 forth in section 1392 of this chapter. Applicants shall comply with all instructions
22 established by the DCA examination vendor for taking the CPLEE.

24 (g) The passing score on the CPLEE shall be determined for each form of the
25 examination by a criterion referenced procedure performed by OPES.

26
27 (h) An applicant for whom English is his or her second language may be eligible for
28 additional time when taking the EPPP and/or the CPLEE. The applicant must complete
29 and submit a request for additional time that states under penalty of perjury that English
30 is his or her second language. The Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)
31 certification score of 85 or below must be sent by Educational Testing Service directly to
32 the Board. The TOEFL must have been taken within the previous two years prior to
33 application. The Board will only consider the highest score of any TOEFL taken within
34 the previous two years. If approved, the applicant will be allotted time-and-a-half (1.5x)
35 when taking the examination.

4 coursework in psychology, not including thesis or dissertation. Pre-doctoral SPE
5 shall be accrued as follows:

6
7 (A) In an internship pursuant to section 2911 of the Code. Registration with the
8 Board is not required; or(B) As an employee of an exempt setting pursuant to
9 section 2910 of the Code. Registration with the Board is not required; or

10
11 (C) As a psychological assistant pursuant to section 2913 of the Code. Registration
12 with the Board prior to commencing work is required.

13
14 (2) Post-doctoral SPE: At least 1500 hours of SPE shall be accrued post-
15 doctorally. “Post-doctorally” means after the date certified as “meeting all the
16 requirements for the doctoral degree” by the Registrar or Dean of the educational
17 institution. Post-doctoral SPE shall be accrued as follows:

18
19 (A) In a post-doctoral placement pursuant to section 2911 of the Code.
20 Registration with the Board is not required; or

21
22 (B) As a psychology associate pursuant to section 2909.5 of the Code.
23 Registration with the Board prior to commencing work is required; or

24
25 (C) As an employee of an exempt setting pursuant to section 2910 of the Code.
26 Registration with the Board is not required; or

27
28 (D) As a psychological assistant pursuant to section 2913 of the Code.
29 Registration with the Board prior to commencing work is required.

30
31 (c) Supervision Requirements:

32
33 (1) All SPE must be overseen by a primary supervisor.

34
35 (A) All primary supervisors must be licensed psychologists who meet the
36 requirements of section 1387.1(a), except for SPE accrued in areas of general
37 applied psychology, including but not limited to applied psychological research,
38 industrial-organizational psychology, applied developmental psychology or
39 consulting psychology, in which case the primary supervisor may be unlicensed.

40
41 If the primary supervisor is unlicensed, the trainee must obtain a co-supervisor who
42 is a licensed psychologist that meets the requirements of section 1387.1(c).

43
44 (B) The primary supervisor may delegate supervision to other licensed mental
45 health professionals who meet the requirements of section 1387.1(b).

(2) Trainees shall have no proprietary interest in the business of the primary or delegated supervisor(s) and shall not serve in any capacity that would hold influence over the supervisor(s)' judgment in providing supervision.

(3) A maximum of 40 hours per week can be credited toward SPE. Time spent in supervision can be counted toward the trainee's SPE. One (1) hour per week must be in direct, individual supervision with the primary supervisor. Additional supervision can be provided by the primary, delegated, or co-supervisor(s). See table below for supervision requirements.

(4) No supervisor shall request, receive, or facilitate the receipt of payment, monetary or otherwise, from the trainee as a condition for the accrual of SPE.

(5) Experience gained while the trainee is functioning under another mental health license shall not be credited toward meeting the SPE requirements for licensure.

(6) Prior to the start of the experience, the primary supervisor and the trainee shall together prepare an agreement (“Agreement”) that outlines the structure and sequence of the planned program of supervision to accomplish the goals and objectives of the experience. Hours accrued prior to preparing such an agreement results in those hours not counting toward the licensure requirements. The original agreement shall accompany the application for licensure, pursuant to 2914 of the Code, and shall include at least the following:

- Name, license number and signature of primary supervisor;
- Name and signature of trainee;
- Statutory authority under which the trainee will function;
- Start date of the experience and the anticipated completion date;
- Duties to be performed in a sequential structured plan as defined in this section;
- Address of the locations at which the duties will be performed;
- Goals and objectives of the plan for SPE, including how socialization into the profession will be achieved; and
- How and when the supervisor will provide periodic assessments and feedback to the trainee as to whether or not he or she is performing as expected; and
- Attestation that both the supervisor and trainee have discussed and understand each term of SPE as required in sections 1387, 1387.1, 1387.4, 1387.5 of the Business and Professions Code.

(7) Once the SPE outlined in the Agreement has been completed, the primary supervisor shall submit to the trainee both the Agreement, unless previously submitted to the Board, pursuant to Section 1387(c)(6), and a verification of experience form signed by the primary supervisor under penalty of perjury, in a sealed envelope, signed across the seal by the primary supervisor, for submission to the Board by the trainee with his or her application for licensure. The verification shall certify to completion of the hours consistent with the terms of the Agreement and contain the following information:

- Name and contact information of the trainee
- Name, license number and contact information of the supervisor
- Start and end date of the experience
- Total number of hours per week worked by the trainee
- Total number of supervised hours per week
- Total number of hours being verified

The supervisor must indicate, in his or her best professional judgment, whether the trainee demonstrated an overall performance at or above the level of competence expected for the trainee’s level of education, training and experience. When SPE is accrued in a formal pre-doctoral internship or post-doctoral training program, the program's training director shall be authorized to perform the verification and rating duties of the primary supervisor provided that the internship training director is a licensed psychologist who possesses a valid, active license free of any disciplinary action.

If the SPE is not consistent with the terms of the agreement, or if the trainee did not demonstrate an overall performance at or above the level of competence expected for the supervisee's level of education, training and experience, then the SPE shall not count towards the licensure requirements.

(8) The trainee shall maintain a written weekly log of all hours of SPE earned toward licensure, in accordance with section 1387.5.

(9) Failure to comply with the requirements of this section shall be considered unprofessional conduct and may subject the supervisor to disciplinary action.

§ 1387.1. Responsibilities of Supervisors.

(a) Primary supervisors shall comply with all of the following requirements:

(1) Prior to functioning as a primary supervisor and every two (2) years thereafter, the supervisor shall complete six (6) hours of approved continuing education in supervision that meets the requirements in section 1397.61(c)(2).

(A) Primary supervisors shall certify under penalty of perjury to completion of the six (6) hour course, as required by this section, each time the supervisor completes a verification of the experience as referenced in section 1387(c)(7).

15 American Psychological Association.

17 (5) Be responsible for monitoring the welfare of clients who receive psychological
18 services rendered by the trainees.

20 (6) Ensure that each client is informed, prior to the rendering of services by the
21 trainee that:

23 (A) The trainee is unlicensed and is functioning under the direction and supervision
24 of the supervisor;

26 (B) The supervisor shall have full access to client records; and

28 (C) Any fees associated with services provided by the trainee shall be paid directly
29 to the supervisor or employer.

31 (7) Be responsible for monitoring the performance and professional development

44 (10) Monitor the supervision provided by delegated supervisors.

46 (11) Be employed or contracted by the same organization as the trainee and be
47 available 100% of the time SPE is being accrued. This availability may be in-
48 person, by telephone, or by other appropriate technology.

1 (12) Ensure that a crisis plan is in place to protect the client in the event a crisis or
2 emergency occurs during any time the supervisor is not physically present at the
3 location the trainee is working. The primary supervisor shall ensure that the trainee

6 (13) Have the education, training and experience in the areas of psychological
7 practice for which they will supervise, and shall be responsible for supervising the
8 psychological functions performed by the psychological assistant and ensure
9 compliance with the provisions of the Code, the Board’s regulations, and the

42 (7) Monitor the welfare of clients or patients who receive psychological services

45 (8) Monitor and report to the primary supervisor the performance and professional
46 development of the trainee.

48 (9) Have no current or former financial, personal, or familial relationship with the
49 trainee, or other relationship that could compromise the supervisor’s effectiveness

4 (c) If SPE is obtained in areas of general applied psychology, a licensed co-supervisor
5 is required if a primary supervisor is not licensed. The co-supervisor shall comply with
6 all of the following requirements:

8 (1) Possess and maintain a valid, active license issued by the Board free of any
9 formal disciplinary action during the period covered by the Plan;

11 (2) Notify the trainee of any current disciplinary action that disqualifies him or her

14 (3) Prior to functioning as a co-supervisor and every two (2) years thereafter, the

37 (7) Ensure that all parties to the Plan comply with the provisions of the Psychology
38 Licensing Law and regulations.

40 (d) Interim supervision by a person other than the primary supervisor may be provided
41 by a person who meets the requirements of section 1387.1(a) for a period not to exceed
42 thirty (30) consecutive calendar days in the event the primary supervisor is unavailable
43 for reasons including, but not limited to, illness, injury or vacation. Interim supervision
44 that is expected to continue for more than thirty (30) consecutive calendar days requires
45 a new Agreement pursuant to 1387(c)(6).

16 being licensed. The licensing examinations shall consist of the Association of State and
17 Provincial Psychology Boards' (ASPPB) Examination for Professional Practice in
18 Psychology (EPPP), and the California Psychology Laws and Ethics Examination
19 (CPLÉE), except for those applicants who meet the criteria in section 1388.6 of this
20 chapter. Such applicants shall be required to take and pass the CPLÉE.

22 (c) An applicant is eligible to take the EPPP upon completion of a qualifying doctorate
23 degree and 1500 hours of qualifying professional experience. An applicant shall pass
24 the EPPP and complete all 3000 hours of supervised professional experience prior to
25 being eligible for the CPLÉE, whichever is applicable, pursuant to section 1388.6.

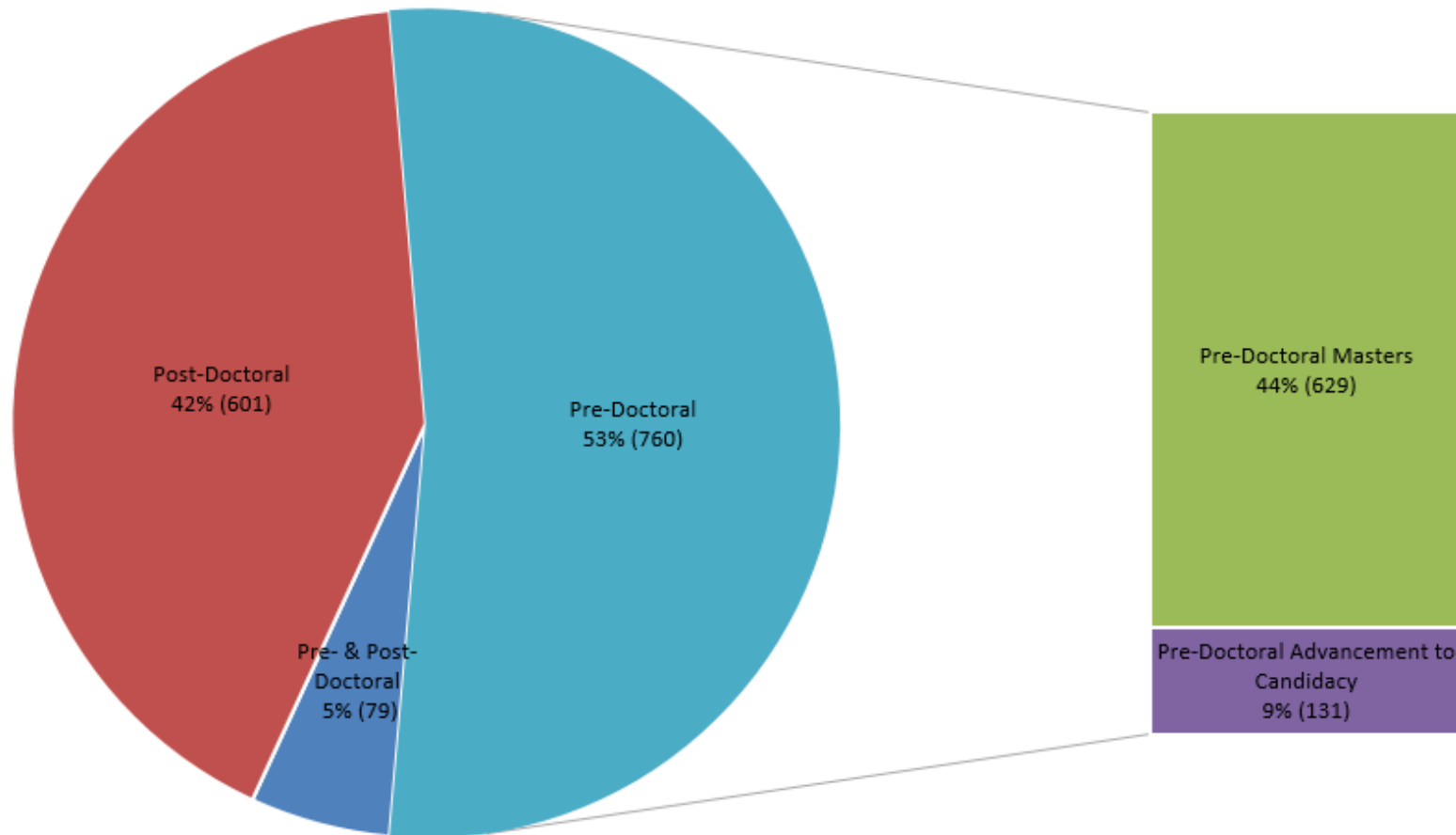
