### Background:

### SME Requirements and Selection Process

### Subject Matter Expert Qualifications

- Hold a current license as a psychologist;
- Be in good standing, having no prior or pending disciplinary actions, and no pending investigations or enforcement actions against them; and
- Agree not to participate in any examination coaching or preparation activities as stated in the agreement signed with the Board upon commencement of examination development activities.
- SMEs who are current government employees must submit in writing from their Department HR that a no conflict of interest exists in regard to Government Code Section 19990.

### **Selection Process**

- The Board randomly selects 1000 or more active licensees (old and new) who are in good standing from the License Population. (Aside from that list, the Board also has an Interested Parties list that contains names of Licensees who have expressed interest in participating at future workshop dates.)
- Extract email addresses from the list and mass email the workshop invitation and the SME Application.
- Staff evaluates and determines eligibility of the licensee. Qualified SMES are assigned to their requested date and/or alternative workshop date.
- A second enforcement review is conducted for each participant prior to notification
- Confirmation of participation in workshops are emailed to licensees.
