SUBJECT	Examination Outline for the California Psychology Law and Ethics Examination

In 2019, the Office of Professional Examination Services (OPES) worked with the California Board of Psychology (Board) to conduct the Occupational Analysis of the Psychologist Profession in California. Upon completion of the occupational analysis (OA), OPES conducted a review of the Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards' (ASPPB's) Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology (EPPP). Based on that review, the examination outline for the California Psychology Law and Ethics Examination (CPLÉE) was updated.

On October 21–22, 2020, a workshop was held with subject matter experts (SMEs) to review the results of the California OA and the current EPPP examination outline. Based on their review, the SMEs confirmed that the results of the OA contained aspects of practice that should continue to be measured on a California law and ethics examination. During the workshop, the SMEs modified the CPLÉE examination outline to reduce redundancy and to better align the content area and subarea weights with practice. The SMEs and OPES made the following changes to the outline:

- Combined content area 8 (“Scientific Research and Publication”) and content area 9 (“Teaching, Training, and Supervision”) into one content area 8: (“Teaching, Training, Supervision, and Research”).
- Revised the proportional weights for content areas 2, 4, and 7.
- Revised the proportional weights for subareas 2.3, 4.3, 4.4, 4.5, 4.6, 5.2, and 5.3.
- Edited task statements T83 and T85.
- Edited knowledge statement K173.
- Deleted task statement T89.
- Deleted knowledge statements K179, K150, K153, K224, and K229.
- Renumbered the task and knowledge statements.

Update to CPLEE Examination Outline

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The updated examination outline will go into effect in January 2022. OPES will work with PSI to ensure that the CPLEE Candidate Information Bulletin reflects the updated CPLEE examination outline. Attached to this memo are (A) a copy of the updated examination outline; (B) a key or linkage map showing the renumbering of the task and knowledge statements; and (C) a summary table showing the content area and subarea weights on the updated examination outline.
